The EdF major prepares future professionals in education who are critical thinkers, well informed about theory and practice, and possess a sophisticated understanding of the social, cultural, and political dimensions of teaching and learning. There are multiple pathways through the Educational Foundations (EdF) major. This is only one example of a program plan. The EdF program is designed to (a) maintain some flexibility in what courses you take and when, (b) allow you to take additional classes related to another major or a minor, and (c) graduate with a BA or BS in 4 years.
